



Top 10 Equity Sectors in % of Fund Volume







Investment Approach

DJE - Asien invests primarily in companies with attractive and promising business models from the Asia-Pacific region. The RCEP (Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership) free trade zone, which was established in 2020, is the largest in the world in terms of its share of global GDP and is expected to contribute to the region's dynamic growth (see chart). The fund's allocation is based on our proprietary, fundamental, top-down (FMM methodology) and bottom-up analysis. We believe that the combination of global macroeconomic analysis along with bottom-up security selection is essential to balance opportunities and risks. The focus of the fund is companies with attractive revenue and earnings growth, stable earnings, potential for innovation and a leading competitive position. The fund management allocates across regions, countries, and sectors of the Asian economic area, independent from any market benchmarks.

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Monthly Commentary

With the exception of Japan, most Asian stock markets fell in November. The stock markets in Hong Kong and South Korea suffered the sharpest falls, while China and India only fell moderately. Donald Trump's re-election as President of the USA - and the possible consequences of this dominated the markets in November. Trump's announcement immediately after his election victory that he intended to impose or increase tariffs once he took office had a particularly negative impact. Import tariffs on Chinese products could therefore potentially rise to 60%. During the election campaign, Trump also announced the introduction of blanket import tariffs of 10 to 20% on all foreign goods. This tightening of customs policy could trigger a global trade war and impact inflation worldwide. At sector level, the picture within the sub-sectors of the Asian investment region was mixed in November. The best performing sectors in relative terms were technology (underweighted in the fund), energy (underweighted in the fund) and consumer staples (underweighted in the fund). The sectors that performed worst in relative terms were industrials (overweight in the fund), real estate (overweight in the fund) and consumer staples (overweight in the fund). Overall, the sector weighting therefore had a negative impact on the fund price performance relative to the benchmark index in November. At individual stock level, the highest performance contributions in November came from the positions of the Japanese companies Sumitomo Mitsui Financial Group (bank) and Recruit Holdings (personnel services) and the Singaporean company DBS Group Holdings (bank). On the other hand, the positions of Alibaba Group Holdings (internet conglomerate), SK Hynix (semiconductors) and Hon Kwok Land Investment (property), among others, had a negative impact. The overweight was increased in the travel and leisure, insurance and utilities sectors. The overweight was reduced in the industrial goods & services and retail sectors. The underweight was reduced in the Banking and Telecommunications sectors. The underweight was increased in the technology and commodities sectors.
