Current fund strategy

Raiffeisen-Osteuropa-Rent (ein Anlagefonds von Raiffeisen Capital Management Österreich) (I) is a bond fund. It invests predominantly in bonds from Central and Eastern European issuers (including Turkey) in the respective national currencies, and bonds denominated in Central and Eastern European currencies (including Turkish lira). The fund management works to optimise the risk-return profile using additional active strategies. The Fund is particularly suitable for investors who wish to benefit from the earnings potential of an Eastern European bond investment and are aware of the related higher risks, ranging from unfavourable currency developments and elevated price volatility to possible loss of capital in the event of strong increases in interest rates or default by issuers.

The fund is actively managed with reference to a benchmark. Such reference to a benchmark does not restrict the fund management's scope of action.




Comments from fund management

Eastern European bonds posted gains in September. The main performance drivers were falling yields in CEE, in parallel with yield declines in the euro area and the USA. Currencies saw very little change, and the lira was the weakest. Eurobonds also saw significant increases since the start of the month.

The country allocation was maintained, with a slightly higher weighting of Turkish bonds versus Czechia. With yields declining, the fund's duration was reduced somewhat.

The focus is still on the interest rate outlook, with the US elections also starting to become a factor. The Fed also completed its first rate cut, which came in on the higher side of the expectations at 0.5%. The current market expectations are that the USA will manage to avoid a recession. This should pave the way for further cuts by the CEE central banks as well, despite inflation rates bottoming out. (23.09.2024)






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Structure by country of domicile (proportion of fund assets)
