Investment Policy

The UBS (Lux) European Small and Mid Cap Equity Long Short Fund aims to generate absolute positive returns by exploiting the inefficiencies of the small and mid-cap markets in Europe with a focus on German speaking countries. The portfolio managers buy the equities they think will perform best, while at the same time selling stocks in companies that, in their views, will underperform the market. The objective is to create a portfolio that has lower volatility, less correlation with the equity markets and a better risk-adjusted performance than a long-only fund.

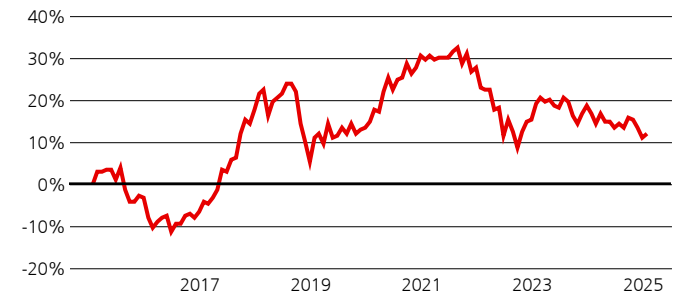

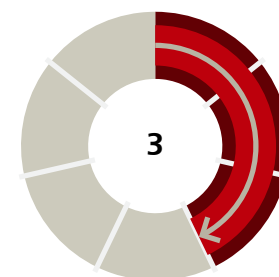

Market commentary

January was strongly driven by macroeconomic and geopolitical events, such as the inauguration of the newly elected US president, a decrease in the interest rate by the ECB, budget discussions in the UK and France and the impact of potential global (and Europe-specific) trade tariffs. The European consumer remains selective in spending overall but showed resilient spending in certain categories (such as e-commerce and travel), partly stimulated by discounts. From a sector performance perspective, cyclicals (such as financials or leisure) have outperformed defensive sectors (such as staples or utilities).

Macroeconomically, PMIs in Europe are still trading at depressed levels. German economic activity remains sluggish with an unemployment rate of 6.1% and inflation around 2.6%. The US presidential outcome sparked some hope regarding the global business environment but quickly resulted in highly US-exposed European companies performing better than non-US exposed companies. In a positive month, the MSCI Small Cap Europe Index rose by 4.73% in January, underperforming large cap indices. The MDAX index increased by +4.46%.

The fund was up +1.02% (retail B share class), mainly due to strong returns within healthcare and communication services.

Within the long exposure, Eckert & Ziegler and CTS Eventim were the best-performing positions. Eckert & Ziegler is a provider of low-level radioactive isotopes for medical purposes. It pre-released positive FY24 figures and continued to show strong growth across its portfolio. Moreover, Eckert & Ziegler announced a Chinese joint venture to license its Actinium-225, further bolstering its product offering to Asian customers. CTS Eventim, a music event operator and ticketing provider, showed a rebound from profit-taking in Q3 FY23 and benefited from strong consumer spending for events and tickets, as well as positive broker upgrades. Puma and Redcare Pharmacy were the worst contributors. Puma fell short of analyst estimations for its financial performance in 2024 and released a muted outlook for 2025, driven by weaker Chinese consumer spending. Although Redcare delivered strong growth in 2024, its shares have suffered recently due to DM drugstore entering the over-the-counter online market. We do not fear this move as the main growth driver for Redcare is electronic prescription in Germany a market DM does not intend to address.

In the short book, our strongest performers were the global shipping company Maersk and the recruitment company Adecco. Maersk suffered from decreasing freight rates and concerns regarding the opening of the Red Sea seaway (leading to higher freight capacity), along with new shipping capacity coming to market. Adecco continued to struggle in a difficult macro environment, with many of its clients having less need for temporary work. The worst short contributors were the asset management firm Aberdeen and Italian automobile company Iveco Group. Aberdeen released better-than-feared results, with better net new money inflows. Moreover, further cost-cutting announcements resulted in investor excitement. Iveco group announced several senior management changes, which investors interpreted as signs of improvement. Additionally, Iveco successfully closed the sale of its firefighting segment, Magirus, to a European private equity fund.

While monetary policy and easing continue to be important factors, the short-term focus will be on the political implementation and execution of the new US president's policies (both for the US itself and the wider, global economic community, with a special focus on potential tariffs across different sectors). While consumers in the US and in Europe remain resilient in their (selected) spending, investors will focus strongly on the implications of decreasing interest rates by the ECB and the FED. European small and mid-caps are expected to perform well due to their sensitivity to the economic cycle. Moreover, any easing of geopolitical tensions and conflicts would support investor sentiment. In particular, a potential end of the war in Ukraine might reduce the risk premium in Europe. We are positive on the European equity markets and had a net exposure of 31.25% at month-end – slightly above our long-term average.
