



Performance commentary

The fund underperformed the benchmark in the fourth quarter, driven by weakness in industrials, the broader Cleantech space, and underperformance of European markets. The Resources sub-theme was down, driven by weakness in Novonesis and renewable energy companies like Vestas. Novonesis consolidated after the outperformance in previous months, although results and guidance confirmed the structural growth case, for example in bioenergy. Vestas disappointed with a margin miss in the third quarter, caused by its service business (Q3 2024 Earnings Call, 05.11.2024), which was poorly timed against the backdrop of heightened market concerns over the impact of the US election on the wind industry. Performance for waste mitigation was soft with Biotage and Valmet down, not least due to weak European stock market sentiment. Biotage posted solid Q3 results with impressive growth for its big molecule business, but a modest decrease for the group gross margin vs. Q2. However, according to the company, this might be temporary and they anticipate an improvement in the fourth quarter (Q3 2024 Earnings Call, 23.10.2024). Carbon reduction technologies performed better with MYR group and Chroma ATE up. MYR Group continued to rebound after the third-quarter beat and the guided profitability improvement ahead as margin dilutive projects should be completed soon (Q3 2024 Earnings Call, 31.10.2024). Chroma ATE outperformed on continuous order momentum for AI testing equipment and the developing opportunity around its new metrology tools (UBS, 31.10.2024).

Market comments

In the fourth quarter, US stocks continued to outperform global peers, with the Nasdaq Composite Index and the S&P 500 up 6.4% and 2.4%, respectively, and the Euro Stoxx 50 Price Index in USD down -8.7% (Bloomberg). In addition to healthy US economic data, lower inflation and support from artificial intelligence (Al) for big tech, the outcome of the US elections fuelled investors' optimism, as the deregulation agenda of the new administration might have a stimulating effect on economic activity. The Federal Reserve's final monetary policy meeting of the year resulted in a 25 basis points (bp) interest rate cut, in line with consensus. However, US stocks and bonds declined as the Fed's projections now indicate only two additional 25bp cuts in 2025, down from four, reflecting stronger economic growth and lower unemployment (UBS House View - CIO Alert, 18.12.2024). The guidance of robust economic growth in the US was echoed by an improvement in small business confidence, which jumped above the 50-year average in November for the first time in nearly three years (Bank of America Institute, 16.12.2024). Although inflation remains a key concern for small companies, rising investments from, for example, reshoring-related fiscal stimulus and better credit availability drive the improvement in confidence, in our view.

Comments on transactions

In the quarter we initiated a position in UK-based IMI plc, as we believe the company's efficiency-related product portfolio will benefit from growing demand around electrification and leakage prevention solutions (e.g.: related to ship engine propulsion, methane leakage). The company's high-specification valves are critical for customers to achieve productivity improvements, which is gaining importance amid the need to efficiently manage flow control in respective industrial and energy-related applications. In addition, we initiated a position in Armstrong World Industries, the largest manufacturer of ceiling tiles and grid systems in North America. The company commands a >50% market share in the US, while its focus on architectural specialties results in a differentiated product offering. The company's "Sustain" product portfolio combines high performance with sustainability criteria, such as low embodied carbon, contributing to a lower carbon intensity in buildings. We believe the company can further benefit from mix improvements, driven by energy-efficient solutions, which may reduce building heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) energy costs and consumption.
