Investment Policy

The fund assets are invested in companies which derive at least 50% of their revenues from products and services that enable, support, and promote the transition from fossil fuels to cleaner energy. Target companies operate across the entire energy value chain, and are well positioned to benefit from long-term growth drivers such as decarbonization through electrification of energy consumption, decentralization of energy systems, and the scarcity in critical materials needed for the energy transition.

Performance commentary

The fund underperformed its benchmark in October. The top contributor to performance was lithium producer Arcadium Lithium, which received a takeover bid from global diversified miner Rio Tinto. Names with nuclear power exposure also contributed positively, driven by positive sentiment after announcements of Big Tech looking to power data centres with nuclear power: US small modular reactor developer NuScale contributed positively to performance, as did Canadian uranium miners Denison Mines and Cameco. The worst performer in portfolio was US renewable energy project owner NextEra Energy Partners, which reported disappointing results. US solar panel manufacturer First Solar also reported weaker-than-expected numbers, as it saw Chinese competition impact its volumes in India. French critical minerals miner Eramet lagged after it announced lower production volumes in manganese ore and nickel ore.

Market comments

Global equity markets traded lower in October, led by falling returns in the materials, consumer staples and healthcare sectors. The US market outperformed, while European and Asian markets lagged. In the US, election campaigns dominated the headlines. US bond yields moved up sharply in October, driven by beliefs of a larger budget deficit and higher inflation under a possible Trump win scenario with higher tariffs. The European Central Bank cut interest rates as inflation in Europe has slowed down. Towards the end of the month, the Bank of Japan left interest rates unchanged. In Russia, the BRICS counties (originally Brazil, Russia, India, China, South Africa, but by now accompanied by Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran, Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates) had their annual summit in which they discussed economic sanctions and how to reduce dependence on the US dollar, amongst others. Third-quarter earnings season brought little surprises, with solid and better-than-expected results in all sectors outside energy and materials.

The International Energy Agency (IEA) published its annual flagship World Energy Outlook in October, this time exploring rising investment in clean technologies, growing electricity demand, electric mobility and the implications for energy security, emissions and economic development. In the US, hyperscalers Google and Amazon Web Services committed to long-term development of nuclear power resources as they need clean and reliable energy to power growing electricity demand of data centres. The European Union implemented a sizeable tariff increase on imports of electric vehicles (EVs) from China towards the end of the month. And after Hurricane Helene made landfall in the US in September, October saw Florida battered by Hurricane Helene, once again highlighting heightened physical risks due to climate change.

oil prices surged at the beginning of the month following Iran's missile attack on Israel, only to come back down towards the end of the month as Israel's limited response alleviated concerns of further escalation as well as Middle East oil supply disruptions. Aluminium prices remained strong, while copper prices retreated somewhat after an initial rally driven by China stimulus.

Comments on transactions

During the month, the fund trimmed its position in Arcadium Lithium, which saw its share price rally on the takeover offer by Rio Tinto. The fund also took some profits in US battery developer QuantumScape and small modular rector company NuScale, as well as Chinese battery company CATL and battery manufacturing equipment company Wuxi Lead, all after strong share price performance. Proceeds were reinvested in US solar cell manufacturer First Solar and South Korean cathode producer L&F. Lastly, the fund exited its position in US-listed electric vehicle charging company Wallbox.
