





Performance review

Under these conditions, the fund produced a positive return on both an absolute and relative basis. The main positive drivers of relative performance were our security selection and sector allocation within Latin America, as well as sector allocation within Asia, Europe and Africa, while security selection within Asia and the Middle East had a negative impact on relative performance. Duration and yield-curve positioning made a marginally negative contribution given the steepening of the curve. From a sector perspective, our overweight in sovereigns, oil & gas and quasi-sovereigns had a positive impact on relative performance, while underweight in utilities, infrastructure and consumer sectors had a negative impact. From a rating perspective, our overweight of high yield-rated versus investment grade-rated issuers had a positive impact on the relative performance, while security selection within both the investment grade and high yield buckets contributed positively during the month of August.

Market Review

In August, the performance of emerging market corporate bonds was positive, driven by lower US Treasury yields and tighter credit spreads. Despite the period of high volatility at the start of the month, August ended with US 2-year Treasury yields tightening by 34 basis points (bp), while yields on 10-year and 30-year Treasury bonds declined by 13bp and 11bp, respectively. The US Treasury curve remains slightly inverted with the yield differential between 2- and 10-year US Treasury notes ending the month at –2bp, having steepened by 21bp over the month. On the credit side, emerging market corporate bond credit spreads rallied, with spreads of investment grade-rated issuers tightening by 7bp while high-yield spreads tightened by 13bp. On a total return basis, Latin America was the best performing region followed by Middle East and Africa, while Europe and Asia Lagged, while still delivering positive total returns.
