



In August, the fund registered a positive return, mainly attributed to coupon carry. In terms of total returns, Japan and supranationals were the major contributors by country. By sector, financials and quasi-sovereigns were the major contributors in terms of total return.

Market Review

In August, Asian credit delivered a positive return of 1.63%, mainly driven by lower US Treasury yields. Investment grade gained 1.82% during the month, outperforming high yield, which rose 0.48%. In terms of country/region,, Philippines and Malaysia outperformed, while China and Pakistan underperformed.


