FUND OBJECTIVE

The fund seeks to maximize current income whilst preserving capital by investing in global high yield bonds (debt securities) that produce investment returns and support better alignment with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (“SDGs”) by engaging with issuers in support of achieving the SDGs. The fund invests primarily in:

- US dollar and non-US dollar denominated high yield fixed income securities that are issued or guaranteed by corporate issuers of any industrial sector
- Short duration, high yield fixed income securities issued by governments and agencies globally that are primarily denominated in US dollars
- The fund may also invest in securities of companies and governments located in emerging (less developed) market countries

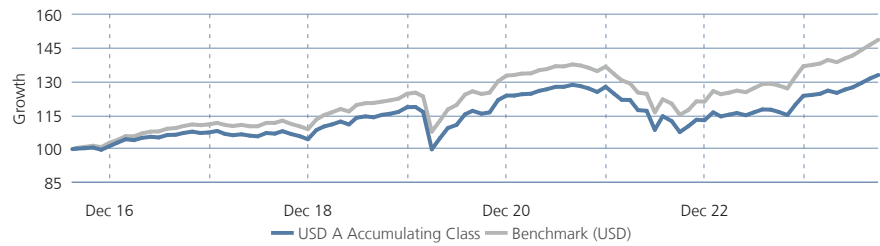

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RISK CONSIDERATIONS

Counterparty Risk: The risk that a counterparty will not fulfil its payment obligation for a trade, contract or other transaction, on the due date.

Operational Risk: The risk of direct or indirect loss resulting from inadequate or failed processes, people and systems including those relating to the safekeeping of assets or from external events.

Sustainable Risk: The fund may focus on investments in companies that relate to certain sustainable development themes and demonstrate adherence to environmental, social and corporate governance practices. This may mean the universe of securities from which the Fund can invest in may be smaller than that of other funds and may underperform the market as a result.

Currency Risk: Investors who subscribe in a currency other than the base currency of the fund are exposed to currency risk. Fluctuations in exchange rates may affect the return on investment. The ICE BofA composite ratings are updated once a month on the last calendar day of the month based on information available up to and including the third business day prior to the last business day of the month. The ICE BofA composite rating algorithm is based on an average of the ratings of three agencies (to the extent rated). Generally the composite is based on an average of Moody's, S&P and Fitch. For holdings that are unrated by the ICE BofA Index composite, credit quality ratings are based on S&P's rating. Holdings that are unrated by S&P may be assigned an equivalent rating by the investment manager. No NRSO has been involved with the calculation of credit quality and the ratings of underlying portfolio holdings should not be viewed as a rating of the portfolio itself. Portfolio holdings, underlying ratings of holdings and credit quality composition may change materially over time.
