FUND OBJECTIVE

The fund aims to achieve a target average return of 3% over the benchmark before fees over a market cycle (typically 3 years) by primarily investing in fixed income instruments issued in the Chinese local currency markets. Effective 25 May 2018 the Fund changed its name from the Neuberger Berman China Onshore Bond Fund to the Neuberger Berman China Bond Fund. Please note that until 3 May 2018 the Fund performance was compared against the J.P. Morgan JADE Broad – Asia Diversified Broad China Index . As of 4 May 2018 the Fund adopted an unconstrained, benchmark agnostic approach, referencing the ChinaBond New Composite Index.

Effective 2 September 2019, the benchmark was changed from the ChinaBond New Composite Index to the FTSE Chinese Government and Policy Bank Bond 0-1 Year Select Index (CNY, Total Return). The fund is actively managed, which means that the investments are selected at the discretion of the investment manager. The fund is not constrained by its benchmark, which is used for comparison purposes only. This change does not affect how the fund is managed.

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RISK CONSIDERATIONS
