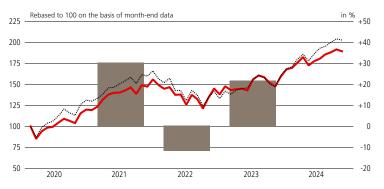

The US large cap equity market delivered a negative performance in October 2024, ending a run of five consecutive months of positive returns. Equity markets started on a positive note in October, but this was reversed in the second half of the month as earnings from big tech names stoked investor concerns.

Monthly performance

In October the fund performed negatively with 1.2%. The fund lagged the broad US stock market, primarily as a result of its exposure to lower-beta and lower-momentum stocks in the index.

YTD performance

YTD as of the end of October, the fund has delivered a positive performance of 12.8%. The fund is lagging the broad US stock market, which is mainly due to its underweight in mega cap tech stocks and its exposure to smaller stocks in the index, as well as low-momentum stocks.

Performance contributors

The financials, communication services and energy sector exposures contributed to fund performance this month. At the stock level, the fund profited from holding Booking Holdings, Visa and Comcast.

Performance detractors

Exposures to the healthcare, materials and consumer staples sectors detracted from fund performance this month. At the stock level, the fund was negatively impacted by holding Apple, Applied Materials and PulteGroup.
