Wellington Euro High Yield Bond Fund



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MARKET REVIEW

Market volatility fell following Donald Trump's win in the US presidential election amid speculation that his economic policies would boost growth and corporate earnings. Most fixed income sectors outperformed on an excess return basis.

Euro high yield returned 0.52% (in local currency terms) in November, as measured by the ICE BofA Merrill Lynch Euro High Yield Constrained Index, underperforming duration equivalent government bonds by 0.54%. The option-adjusted spread of the index widened by 14 basis points to 331 basis points.

HCOB eurozone manufacturing PMI dipped further into contraction territory and industrial production slowed. Germany's IFO business climate index weakened and assessment of current conditions and expectations both fell. UK's annual headline inflation reached the highest level since April, while industrial production declined.

FUND PERFORMANCE AND ATTRIBUTION

- The portfolio outperformed its benchmark during the month.
- In aggregate, sector allocation had a positive impact on relative performance during the month. An overweight to the financial institutions sector and overweight to restaurants contributed to relative results. In contrast, an overweight to the technology sector and overweight to wirelines detracted from relative results.
- In aggregate, security selection had a positive impact on relative performance during the month. From a sector perspective, the largest contributors were security selection within financial institutions and the government & government related industries. In contrast, the largest negative detractors were security selection within cable and satellite and packaging.
- The largest relative contributor was an overweight to Canary Wharf Group and the largest relative detractor within technology was an overweight to Cerved Group.
- Canary Wharf Group engages in the ownership, development, and management of the Canary Wharf Estate. Refinancing risks of upcoming
 maturities have reduced as financing commitments are secured. Given positive performance, we are trimming our position as our thesis has
 played out. Cerved Group provides credit risk management and analysis services. We are constructive on Cerved given their high free cash
 flow generation, strong market positioning, and strategic relationship with ION Investments which has a positive track record of achieving
 cost synergies.

FUND POSITIONING AND OUTLOOK

- The Fund remains positioned with a modestly defensive risk posture as high yield spreads remain tight. However, we think further bouts in volatility may present opportunities to tactically increase risk at more attractive valuations. Our largest sector level overweights are in the technology and financial institutions sectors. Within technology, our exposure is focused on issuers that have stable, recurring revenue sources such as software service companies and cybersecurity providers. On the other hand, we are more cautious on sectors experiencing increased capacity and therefore remain underweight the automotive sector. In terms of credit quality, the fund remains underweight BBrated bonds and overweight investment grade and B-rated bonds.
- From a macroeconomic perspective, a soft-landing scenario appears to be playing out in the US economy and the Fed began easing. While market expectations call for the Fed to slow its pace of cuts, the risk is that they potentially move to keeping rates flat or increasing them again the "false landing" scenario. The US presidential election remains in focus as the market begins to digest potential policy changes which may be a source of volatility. In terms of corporate fundamentals, earnings remain relatively strong and we are less concerned about the impact of tighter monetary policy on fundamentals. We continue to prefer companies with stable to improving credit profiles.
- We believe default rates are likely to stay around long-term averages over the next 12 months. We do not see a full-scale default cycle on the horizon given the higher quality composition of the high yield market relative to past cycles. In terms of valuations, high yield spreads remain inside historical medians although we believe current yields may be attractive to longer-term focused investors. Euro high yield valuations continue to appear more attractive relative to the US, particularly when controlling for compositional differences at the sector and rating level.
