What is this product?

The product is a sub-fund of Protea Fund, an Undertaking for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities (UCITS) incorporated as a variable capital investment company (SICAV) under the laws of Luxembourg.

The Sub-Fund is established for an unlimited duration. However, the board of directors may also propose to dissolve a sub-fund at a general meeting of that subfund

Objectives and investment policy

Deliver superior performance in relative term over the medium to long term horizon. The Sub-Fund will mainly invest in a select portfolio of equities and equity related securities of companies which are domiciled, headquartered or exercise the predominant part of their economic activity in Europe.

Except the geographical focus, the choice of investments will neither be limited by an economic sector nor in terms of currencies in which investments will be denominated. However, depending on financial market conditions, a particular focus can be placed in a single country (or some countries) and/or in a single currency and/or in a single economic sector.

Furthermore, the Investment Manager intends to invest in listed companies whose capital and/or voting rights are significantly owned, controlled and/or managed directly or indirectly by one or several families.

On an ancillary basis, the Sub-Fund may invest in any other type of eligible assets, such as debt securities, money market instruments, structured products, undertakings for collective investment (UCIs), cash.

Investments in units or shares of UCIs shall not exceed 10% of the net assets of the Sub-Fund.

The Sub-Fund may invest up to 30% of its net assets in Money Market Instruments and undertakings for collective investment (UCI) offering an exposure to the above-mentioned asset classes.

The Sub-Fund may invest in structured products, such as notes, certificates or any other transferable securities.

Derivatives For hedging and for any other purposes, the Sub-Fund may use all types of financial derivative instruments traded on a regulated market and/or over the counter provided they are contracted with leading financial institutions specialized in this type of transactions and subject to regulatory supervision. However, the Investment Manager intends to use principally, for hedging purposes, options, futures and forward exchange contracts. The total commitment arising from financial derivative instruments, for purposes other than hedging, does not exceed 100% of its net assets.

Benchmark The Sub-Fund is actively managed. The index STOXX Europe 600 (Net Return) EUR (SXXR) is used for the calculation of the performance fee (payable to the investment manager). The benchmark index of the Sub-Fund is STOXX Europe 600 (Net Return) EUR (SXXR). It is mentioned for performance comparison purposes. The Sub-Fund does not track the index and can deviate significantly or entirely from the benchmark index.

Dividend Policy This Class is cumulative. Dividend distributions are not planned.

Share Class Currency The currency of the Class is EUR.

The recommended holding period of this product is determined to allow sufficient time for this product to reach its objectives and avoiding short term market fluctuations.

The return of the product is determined using the Net Asset Value (the "NAV") calculated by FundPartner Solutions (Europe) S.A. (the "Administrative Agent"). This return depends mainly on the market value fluctuations of the underlying investments.

The product is reserved for institutional investors. The product is compatible with investors who may bear capital losses and who do not need capital guarantee. The product is compatible with clients looking for growing their capital and who wish to hold their investment over 3 years.

Asset segregation The assets and liabilities of each sub-fund are segregated by law, which means that the performance of the assets in other sub-funds does not influence the performance of your investment.

Dealing The NAV for the Sub-Fund is calculated on each Business Day. The cut-off time to submit subscription and/or redemption orders is 4 p. m. Luxembourg time on the bank business day preceding the relevant calculation day.

Switching Shareholders may apply for any shares of any sub-funds to be converted into shares of another sub-fund, provided that the conditions for accessing the target class or sub-fund are fulfilled with respect to this sub-fund, on the basis of their respective NAV calculated on the Valuation Day following receipt of the conversion request. The redemption and subscription costs connected with the conversion may be charged to the shareholder as indicated in the prospectus. The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 3 years.

We have classified this product as 5 out of 7, which is a medium-high risk class.

This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium-high level, and poor market conditions will likely impact our capacity to pay you.

Be aware of currency risk. You will receive payments in a different currency, so the final return you will get depends on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

Other risks materially relevant to the PRIIP not included in the summary risk indicator: Liquidity risks, Counterparty risks, Operational risks, Risks from the use of derivatives.

This product does not include any protection from future market performance, so you could lose some or all of your investment. If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment.

Performance scenarios

What happens if FundPartner Solutions (Europe) S.A. is unable to pay out?

The Management Company is not making any payment to you in relation to the Sub-Fund and you would still be paid in case of a default from the Management Company.

The Sub-Fund's assets are held with a separate company, the Depositary, so the Sub-Fund's ability to pay out would not be affected by the insolvency of the Management Company. However, in the event of the Depositary's insolvency, or its delegates, the Sub-Fund may suffer a financial loss. However, this risk is mitigated to a certain extent by the fact the Depositary is required by law and regulation to segregate its own assets from the assets of the Sub-Fund. The Depositary will also be liable to the Sub-Fund or its investors for any loss arising from, among other things, its negligence, fraud or intentional failure properly to fulfill its obligations (subject to certain limitations).

If the Sub-Fund is terminated or wound up, the assets will be liquidated and you will receive an appropriate share of any proceeds but you may lose part or all of your investment.

There is no compensation or guarantee scheme protecting you from a default of the Depositary.

What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario.

Conversions between sub-funds are subject to a commission of maximum 1% of the NAV of the shares to be converted.

How long should I hold it and can I take my money out early?
