You are about to purchase a Product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

What is the product?

Type: This Product is a unit in a Fund qualifying as an alternative investment fund under the law of 12 July 2013 on alternative investment fund managers and the AIFMD regulation.

Term: This Product has no maturity date. The Fund has been established for an indefinite period of time. The Management Company is entitled to liquidate, merge or reposition the Product at any time unilaterally in case the Product can no longer be managed in the interest of the investors. The amount the investor will receive upon early termination may be less than the amount invested.

Objectives: The investments in this Fund are actively managed. The amounts entrusted to the Fund aim at achieving a real increase in value over the long term as well as at contributing to the development of the financial sector in developing and emerging countries and by doing so enhancing the access to financial services to promote entrepreneurial activity, boost the economy and/or create employment. For this purpose, the Fund invests its money so that local, successful, respectively promising financial service providers can provide specific financial services to micro, small and medium-sized enterprises ('MSMEs') over the long term and, depending on demand, are in a position to achieve meaningful growth. In addition, the Fund can also invest to a limited extent directly in successful or promising small and medium-sized enterprises ('SMEs') and in actors that are involved in the agriculture value chain ('AVCAs'). An analysis of the investment targets is part of a quantitative rating system.

The Fund may invest in the following investment categories: loan and debt securities, shareholdings (incl. Private equity), and liquidity/money market. The Fund invests primarily in different types of debt instruments. The Fund may also hold a limited portion of equity capital (shares, dividend right certificates, cooperative shares, participation certificates, etc.), either directly or indirectly. The Fund may not invest more than 30% of its assets directly in SMEs and AVCAs and may not hold, either directly or indirectly, more than 25% of its assets as equity capital (incl. Private equity). Solely in order to finance foreseeable liquidity shortfalls, the Fund may take up loans on a temporary basis, provided these do not total more than 10% of the Fund's assets. The Fund does not aim at a constant average duration of capital tie-up for its investments. Typically, this period will be between two and three years. The beneficiary institutions (financial institutions focused on micro, small and medium-sized enterprises, SMEs, AVCAs) are usually domiciled in developing and transition countries, primarily in Latin America, Africa, Central and Eastern Europe, as well as Asia. The investments are usually in US dollars or euro and, to a limited extent, in freely convertible local currencies of the target countries (non-OECD area).

The Fund has a sustainable investment objective (within the meaning of Article 9 of Regulation (EU) 2019/2088). Details are available in the prospectus and the ESG website disclosure of the Fund.

The Fund uses derivatives transactions for the purposes of hedging interest rate and currency risk. The Fund currency is USD, and the currency of this unit class is CHF.

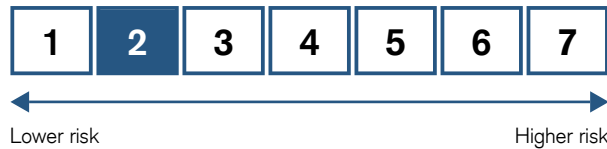
The income generated by the Fund is reinvested, not distributed.

On the last business day of each month (Redemption Date), the management company redeems Units in the Fund at the redemption price. The redemption request must be received by a distribution agent by 3:00 p.m. Central European Time at least ninety (90) calendar days before the respective Redemption Date. Under certain circumstances, the management company may temporarily suspend calculation of the net asset value as well as the issue and redemption of Units.

Intended Retail Investor: This Product is intended for professional and institutional investors, as well as sophisticated retail investors with sufficient knowledge and experience in collective investment schemes and similar products, an ability to bear a minor investment loss, and a long-term investment horizon.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

(A) Summary Risk Indicator



The risk indicator assumes you keep the Product for 5 years. The actual risk can vary significantly if you redeem at an early stage and you may get back less. You may not be able to cash in early.

This Product is considered to be illiquid.

The Summary Risk Indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this Product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the Product will lose money because of movements in the markets. We have classified this Product as 2 out of 7, which is a low risk class and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you. **Be aware of currency risk** if your reference currency differs from the currency of the Product. You may receive payments in a different currency, so the final return you will get depends on the exchange rate between the two currencies. Recommended holding period: 5 years
