What is this product?

Type

A contractual investment fund of the "other funds for traditional investments" type.

Term

The investment fund is established for an indefinite period. The Fund Management Company may initiate the dissolution of the investment fund by terminating the fund agreement.

Objectives

Investment Objective

The Fund's investment objective is to achieve long-term capital growth.

Investment Policy

The Fund invests in equity securities and rights of small and medium-sized companies which have their registered office or which conduct most of their business in Switzerland or Liechtenstein.

In addition to financial considerations, the Fund integrates environmental, social and governance (ESG or sustainability) aspects into every step of the investment process. The following approaches are applied: standards-based exclusions of JSS, positive screening, ESG integration and stewardship.

The SPI Extra ® TR Index serves as a benchmark for judging the success of the investments. However, the index does not constrain the selection of

Fund investments. The asset manager has complete discretion in making the investment decisions.

Share Class Policy:

This unit class of the Fund distributes income to investors in December as a general rule.

You can buy and sell units in this Fund on any bank business day in Switzerland.

Intended retail Investor

The Fund is suited to investors with a long-term investment horizon seeking capital growth. It is intended as a supplementary investment in the Swiss small and mid-cap sector for retail investors. The value of equities is primarily influenced by market and sector-specific factors and may therefore rise as well as fall. Small and mid-cap equities are subject to comparatively higher price risk. Investors can exploit any resulting fluctuations in the net asset value of the fund units and are not tied to a specific date on which to realise the investment.
