What is this product?

TYPE OF PRODUCT

The Fund is a sub-fund of U ACCESS, an Undertaking for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities (UCITS) incorporated as a variable capital investment company (SICAV) under the laws of Luxembourg.

TERM

The Fund is established for an unlimited duration. However the Board of Directors of the Fund may decide on its pure and simple liquidation if its net assets represent less than EUR 20 million (or equivalent value in another currency) or if the economic and/or political environment was to change or for any economic and financial reasons for which the Board of Directors considers that it is in the general best interests of shareholders to liquidate the Fund.

OBJECTIVES

The Fund seeks to grow capital and generate income by investing in a combination of an equity strategy (between 60% and 80%) and a fixed income strategy (between 20% and 40%).

The allocation between the 2 sub-strategies will be actively managed.

The **30 Global Leaders Equity strategy** invests primarily in worldwide equities (around 30 positions) and is long-term oriented. It is focused on large market capitalization and leading companies in their particular business fields, which are expected to provide growth and leading levels of Cash Flow Return on Investment (CFROI[®] Credit Suisse HOLT).

The selection of stocks includes Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) considerations which can be an important driver for risks associated with an investment and for maintaining or improving CFROI[®] of a company. The qualitative sustainable analysis is partly based on inputs provided by MSCI ESG Research and on the manager's own analysis. The strategy is managed for an ESG quality score superior to that of the MSCI AC World Net Return Index at all times and also promotes a lower carbon footprint than its investment universe.

The manager performs a negative screening and a norm-based screening to filter the investment universe. ESG related information is entering the proprietary Discounted Cash Flow models of companies. The portfolio construction will consider the overall ESG score as well as the contribution to risk that arises from ESG exposures. The ESG analysis covers 100% of the portfolio.

The **Corporate Euro Bond strategy** invests primarily in bonds denominated in EUR issued by companies with a minimum rating of BBB- (S&P or Fitch) or Baa3 (Moody's) and may invest up to 15% of its net assets in non-rated products/issuers. A minimum of 50% of the bond investments will be in issuers with a minimum ESG rating of BBB for developed market issuers and BB for emerging market issuers as measured by MSCI ESG research or if such rating is not available an equivalent internal rating assigned by the manager. ESG investment strategy is based on three pillars: (i) Sector exclusion according to the UBP Responsible Investment policy; (ii) ESG integration to select issuers through the analysis of ESG and financial factors; (iii) a preference for Green, Social and Sustainability bonds.

This strategy aims to outperform the ICE BofA Euro Large Cap Corporate Index and may invest up to 20% in High yield, 20% in Emerging countries, 20% in Contingent Convertible capital bonds (CoCos) with a minimum rating of B- (S&P or Fitch) or B3 (Moody's).

The Fund, through aggregation of both sub-strategies, may invest its net assets up to:

- 88% in Emerging countries
- 80% in equity
- 40% in fixed income
- 40% in UCITS funds
- 18% in convertible bonds (including CoCos)
- 8% in High yield
- 4% in Asset-Backed & Mortgage-Backed Securities.

The Fund may use derivative instruments such as but not limited to Credit Default Swaps (CDS), FX forward, interest rate swaps and futures.

The Fund's base currency is EUR.

The recommended holding period is determined to allow sufficient time for this product to reach its objectives and provide a consistent return less dependent on market fluctuations. Nevertheless, such return is not guaranteed.

The return of the product is determined using the Net Asset Value (NAV) calculated by the Administrative Agent. This return depends mainly on the market value fluctuations of the underlying investments.

Any income received by the Fund is reinvested (capitalisation share).

INTENDED RETAIL INVESTORS

The Fund is suitable for retail investors with limited knowledge of the underlying financial instruments and no financial industry experience. The Fund is also suitable for investors who may bear capital losses, who do not need capital guarantee and who wish to hold their investment over 5 years.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk indicator



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 5 years.

The risk can be significantly different if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because the Fund is not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 4 out of 7, which is a medium risk class.

This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium level. Poor market conditions could impact the Fund's capacity to pay you.

Be aware of currency risk. You will receive payments in a currency other than your local currency, so the final return you will get depend on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

This Fund does not include any protection from future market performance, so you could lose some or all of your investment. If the Fund is not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment.

Performance scenarios

What happens if the product is unable to pay out?

There is no guarantee in place against the default of the Fund and you could lose your capital if this happens.

The Fund's assets are held with BNP Paribas S.A., Luxembourg Branch and are segregated from the assets of other sub-funds of the SICAV and from the assets of the Depository. The assets of the Fund cannot be used to pay the debts of other sub-funds.

In the event of insolvency of the Depository, the Fund may suffer a financial loss.

In the event of insolvency of the product manufacturer, the Fund's assets will not be affected.

What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

Costs over time (*)

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario.
- EUR 10'000 is invested.

How long should I hold it and can I take my money out early?

Recommended Holding Period (RHP): 5 years.

The RHP is determined to allow sufficient time for this product to reach its objectives and to provide a consistent return less dependent on market fluctuations. Investors should be prepared to remain invested for at least 5 years but can nevertheless redeem their investment at any time, or hold the latter for a longer period of time.

The Net Asset Value (NAV) is daily except if it is not a full bank business day in Luxembourg or in the United Kingdom or Eurex (each a Business Day). The NAV is calculated the following full bank business day in Luxembourg (Calculation Day). Redemptions are possible on each NAV date. All redemption requests must be received in good order by the Registrar and Transfer Agent prior to 13:00 (Luxembourg time) one (1) Business Day prior to the NAV Date. Redemption proceeds shall be paid within two (2) Business Days following the Calculation Day.
