WHAT IS THIS PRODUCT?

Type: Impax Global Social Leaders Fund (the "Fund") is a sub-fund of Impax Funds (Ireland) plc, an open-ended investment company with variable capital incorporated in Ireland with registered number 393658 and authorised by the Central Bank of Ireland as an umbrella fund with segregated liability between sub-funds and as an undertaking for collective investment in transferable securities pursuant to the European Communities (Undertakings for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities) Regulations 2011, as amended. Segregated liability between sub-funds means that the assets and liabilities of each sub-fund are segregated by law. The prospectus and periodic reports are prepared for Impax Funds (Ireland) plc at umbrella level. You may switch your shares in the Fund to shares in other sub-funds in which you are eligible to invest. 


